The business car and caboose are getting new roofs! After many months of having a flopping roof and a tarp covered car, the roof and bits of the siding is currently being rebuilt. Sections of siding on the business car are being redone due



to rot. On behalf of the RRA, I would like to give a big thanks to John Nevins for heading up the project, along with the members who have put in much time and effort along with him.

Our spring cleaning date has been set for May 18th. We will be meeting at the depot at 8:00 A.M. Please come on down to help for any amount of time. Any help will be appreciated.

The Depot layout is being re-wired. \$200 is allocated for new buss wire. Along with that, it was proposed that the club bring the layout up

to date with some of the newest technology and refurbish the switch wiring so they are not ran off track power. A motion was made to allocate \$900 to buy new digital switches controllers, another booster, and any other parts needed to finish the power zoning. The wiring is just in its beginning stages, with a great many more track feeds being added before buss lines can even be installed. The main lines however are being prioritized and should be fully operational by Memorial Day opening weekend.

They're inexpensive to make and can turn a profit easily, with minimal work.

However, we would like to remind all a coat of paint only hides the true work that must be done. Please feel free to volunteer some time every Monday.
