They held all the op sessions on Friday, all but two of the clinics on Saturday and all the layout tours on Sunday. This greatly reduced the conflicts in the schedule and was well received by the attendees. I should note that two of the eight railroad clinics were presented by SCWD members. Bob Wundrock put on a clinic covering the Operations of the San Diego RR Museum La Mesa Layout. Allen Hinck put on a clinic covering construction of wood structures. Jim Hediger of Model Railroader Magazine was the featured speaker at the banquet. I will let others repeat the humorous stories from his speech. I want to mention the one he told while we were standing in line at the bar. The turnout at the bar was a bit more than the hotel had planned on. It triggered a memory of one of the steam excursions he had gone on back in the end of steam era. It was a 22 car train. The turnaround point was a small town in Michigan. Nobody had informed the town that 22 car loads of rail fans would be showing up for lunch! If you could eat it, it sold out.

You should be able to find details in the next edition of the region newsletter. My short report is that the region is in good financial shape and the board is fully staffed. And it would be a good thing if more of us voted in the Regional elections.

One of the discussion items for the board was the location of future regional conventions. There will not be a regional convention in 2016 because of the National Convention to be held in Indianapolis. The next one would be in the spring of 2017. The Region is still looking for a Division willing to host it. If the normal rotation is followed, the SCWD would be hosting the 2019 regional convention. So we have a little time to prepare for it.

Another major discussion item for the board was the recently announced NMRA policy "that the maximum number of visits by individual guests shall be limited to three" at Division and Region events and then they would be required to join the NMRA to continue to attend. I suspect many of you have heard about this through the NMRA magazine or a newsletter. The policy was not well received by most of the Regional Board. I won't go into the details of the 15 minutes of discussion that occurred before the region voted to ask the National to clarify what they were trying to do with this policy. Personally, I can't say enough bad things about the policy as presented. It has so many conflicts with what the SCWD is all about that I just don't know here to stop. I know the National is dealing with a problem in some regions of non-NMRA members serving in official capacity on NMRA boards but there has got to be a better way to deal with it than the language used in this policy. The good news is that it is only a policy and the SCWD can continue to operate as it always has. We will welcome all current and future model railroaders to our events. No one will be turned away because they are not a member of the NMRA. We will also continue our current practice that they will not be allowed to serve in any official NMRA capacity or participate in activities that require NMRA membership.

On a more upbeat note, our May meeting is the annual joint meeting with the Rock River Valley Division and I hope to see you there.

Results tight in Modeling Project adult vote A runaway for the youth entries

John Breitenfeldt's entry (Y-1) in the Youth Modeling Project popular vote contest was a runaway winner,

garnering more votes than the second and third place finishers combined.



John Breitenfeldt's first place youth E. Row Photo His entry of an abandoned branch railroad station was a fine piece of modeling with splendid detail. With his entry, John earned a \$75 gift certificate for the Madison Hobby Stop. There were six entries to consider.

A pair of brothers, Levi and Owen Bradley took home second and third places, respectively, in the Youth Modeling Project. Levi's entry (Y-5) was a well-detailed branch line station featuring a well modeled station, Burlington Northern caboose, grade crossing with a race car waiting for the train to pass and a number of people about the station. The diorama also featured a small pond. Levi walked out the door with a \$50 gift certificate for the Madison Hobby Stop

Owen's efforts (Y-4) were also of a well detailed branch line station in a scene with two well-modeled trees, a picnic table, a family of bears roaming the area and well ballasted track. When Owen next goes to the Madison Hobby Stop, he'll have a \$25 gift certificate.

Only one vote separated the first place and the two tiedfor-second entries in the adult Modeling Project competition. Sharing the second and third place gift certificates that total \$75, \$37.50 each, are Phil Hottmann (entry A-8) and Matt Baumgart (entry A-4). Phil's well-done entry showed a well-weathered speeder shed, a turnout with a wonderfully weathered godola on the spur, a Model A or T pickup and scenery.

Matt's modeling effort turned what originally was to be a speeder shed into an old cabin somewhere along the Mississippi River between Prairie du Chien and La Crosse, Wisconsin. His well detailed diorama featured full scenery, a fine tin-roofed cabin, probably one room. Matt said that the setting is between the river and the BNSF mail (Aurora Sub) that runs along the river. The cabin is on the shore of the river with the rocks and sand representing the water's edge.

Dave Casey, no stranger to placing well in the SCWD Model Project, presented the Wyeville Speeder Shed (entry A-6) sitting next to a wonderfully detailed and well modeled station. In the background, between the two structures, is an embarrassed person sitting on the outhouse throne. Detail abounds in this prize-winning diorama with people sitting and standing, a delivery truck dormer windows, and well-placed detail objects. Dave earned a \$75 gift certificate for the Madison Hobby Stop.




Operating on Hans Schlegels layout








2015 SCWD Summer Picnic

The 2015 SCWD Summer Picnic will be held on Saturday, July 25th, like last year at Little Amerricka in Marshall, WI. In Memoriam

Donald B. Manlick, 1937-2015

Donald B. Manlick, National Model Railroad Association Master Model Railroader no. 56, died on February 7, 2015. He was 77 years old.



Don produced decals (Herald King and DM Custom Decals); scratchbuilt HO scale freight cars, structures, and car ferries; and was active in railroad historical societies. In addition to Don's hobby activities, he spent more than 32 years working for the Chicago & Northwestern as a clerk, telegrapher, and switchman.

Positive Train Control implementation date may be extended

U.S. Senator Roy Blunt (R-Mo.) introduced a bill on March 4 to extend the deadline for positive train control (PTC) rollout in the U.S. to at least December 2020. The current law requires all railroads that carry passengers or that haul hazardous-by-inhalation material on main lines to install a PTC system by Dec. 31, 2015. Senators referred bill S.650, the Railroad Safety and Positive Train Control Extension Act, to the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. Sens. Claire McCaskill (D-Mo.), John Thune (R-S.D.), and Bill Nelson (D-Fla.) joined Blunt as co-sponsors for the bill.
